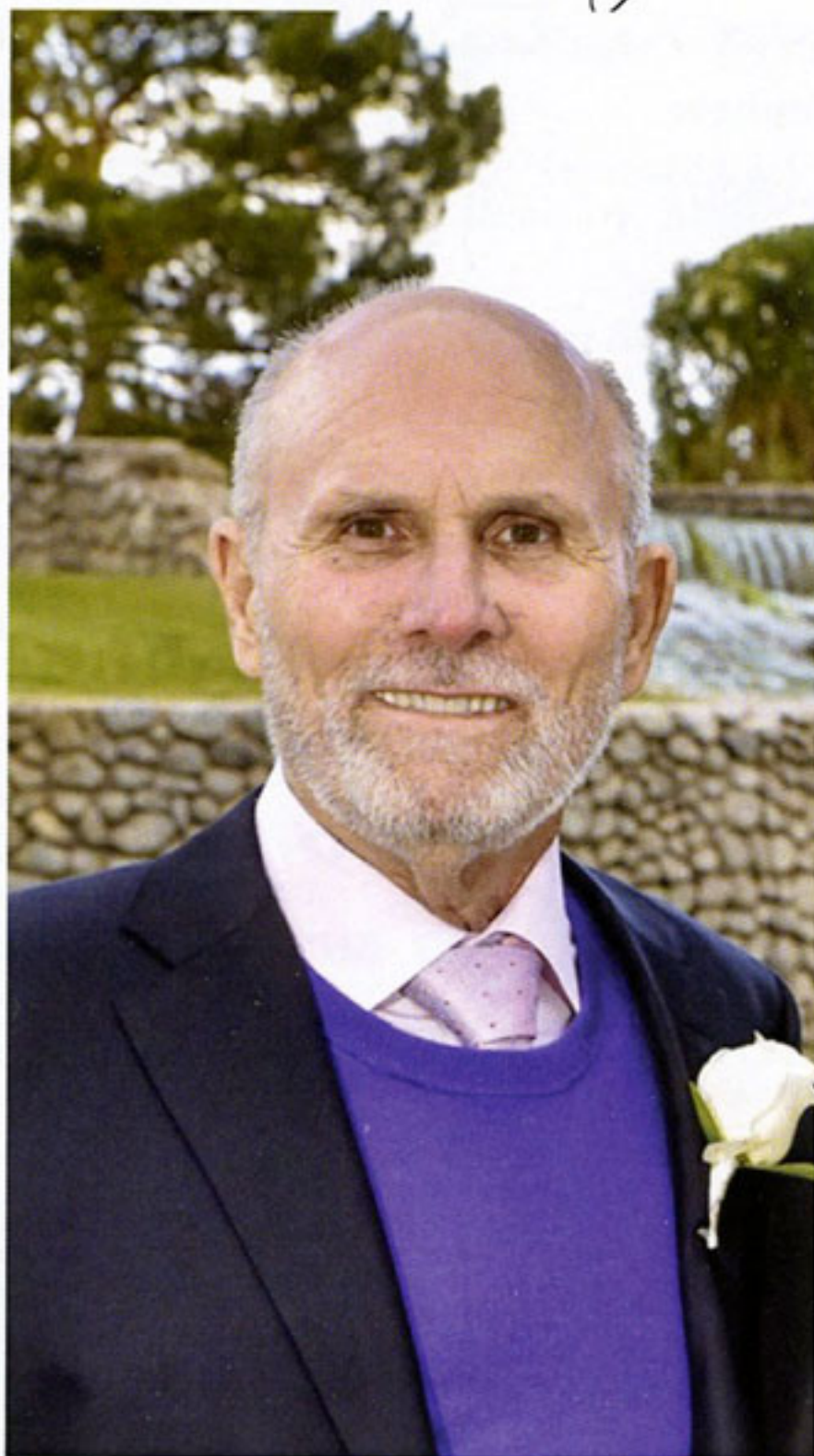

## They Walk Beside Us

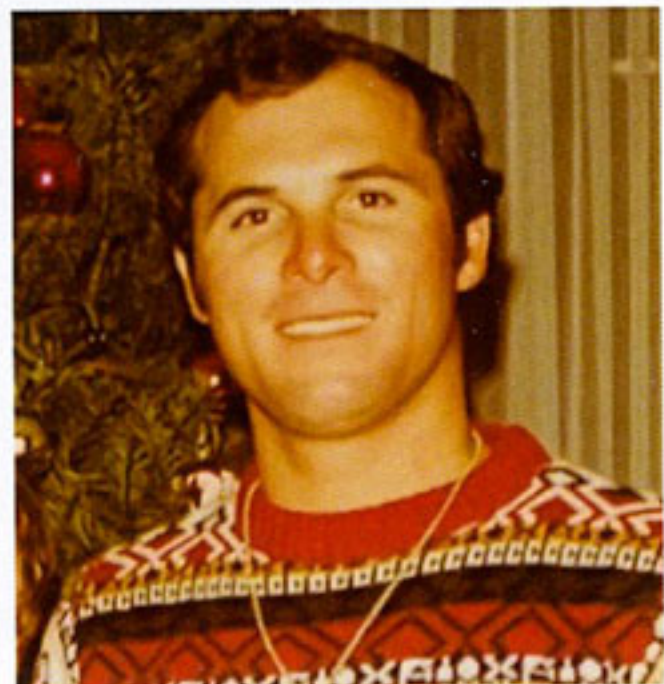
